Healthcare Interventions

- Cancer Care at National Cancer Institute, Nagpur, Maharashtra: NTPCs financial support for infrastructure, medical equipment, and a mobile cancer detection unit has enhanced early detection and accessibility. Over 2,000 screenings have increased hospital footfall, with structured referrals and ASHA workers ensuring continuity of care. Integration with government schemes and proactive maintenance ensures sustainability, with plans for expanded diagnostics and outreach.
- Burn Unit at AIIMS Bhubaneswar, Odisha: NTPC established Odishas first dedicated burn unit, providing 21 inpatient beds and serving 1520 outpatient cases daily. The unit has improved surgical interventions, intensive care, and recovery rates. Institutional integration and future technological advancements ensure long-term impact and accessibility.

Educational Infrastructure Development

- GHSS Munderi, Kannur, Kerala: NTPC addressed infrastructure gaps by constructing a dining block, overhead tank, fire tank, and septic tank, enhancing hygiene, safety, and learning conditions. Access to clean water and fire safety measures has reduced health risks and strengthened emergency preparedness, with durable infrastructure ensuring sustained benefits.
- English Medium School, Kalahandi, Odisha: NTPCs construction of a school with transportation and furnishings has improved access to quality education for underserved students. Enhanced facilities have reduced dropout rates, increased attendance, and improved academic outcomes, fostering long-term socioeconomic upliftment.
- Government Schools, Supaul, Bihar: By providing desks and benches, NTPC eliminated the need for students to sit on the floor, improving classroom conditions, student motivation, and enrollment, particularly for economically disadvantaged students.

• Govindnagar, Bankhedi, Hoshangabad, Madhya Pradesh: NTPCs construction of ventilated classrooms and a multipurpose assembly hall has enhanced learning spaces, supporting academic and cultural activities. Community engagement and institutional support ensure sustainable educational improvements.

Sports Development

• Archery Sports Initiative: NTPCs support has strengthened archery through structured training pathways, from grassroots to elite levels. Improved equipment access and exposure to high-level tournaments have boosted athlete performance and inclusivity, with institutional backing ensuring long-term development.

Girl Empowerment Mission (GEM) Programme

The GEM programme, a four-week residential workshop for girls aged 1012 from underprivileged backgrounds, promotes holistic education, life skills, and extracurricular activities to foster self-reliance and confidence. Key impacts include:

- Educational and Skill Development: The programme significantly enhanced beneficiaries proficiency in English and their mother tongues, alongside a strong understanding of cyber safety principles. Beneficiaries demonstrated greater knowledge and confidence compared to non-beneficiaries.
- Sustainability and Knowledge Sharing: An impressive proportion of participants share their learning with family and friends, with a strong desire to continue learning, fostering a culture of continuous education and knowledge dissemination.
- Social Return on Investment (SROI): The programmes SROI ratio of 3.75 reflects substantial value creation through intangible benefits such as coaching, personal development, and extracurricular activities.
